TREATMENT

- > The passepartout housing was opened from the recto mechanically with a dull scalpel.
- Upon opening the passepartout it was determined that the housing was in good condition and only cleaning was needed. The glass was cleaned with 50:50 alcohol/distilled water, swabbed on.
- The image plate was coated with asphalt on the emulsion side. The glass side was cleaned with 50:50 alcohol/distilled water, swabbed on.
- The plate was replaced in the passepartout and held in place with P-90 Filmoplast tape, and backed with a piece of black acrylic velvet. The original paper backing was then replaced with PVA.
- The paper tape edges of the passepartout were consolidated with PVA and fills were done with Golden acrylic toned Japanese tissue.
- > Additional inpainting was done with Winsor and Newton watercolours.

Total Time of Treatment: 4 hours
